Community:

Ulysses School District serves the educational needs of Ulysses, Kansas. The district consists of one high school, one middle school, one K-2 elementary school (including the pre-school and pre-K), and one 3-5 elementary school. The student body is culturally diverse with a population of 59% Hispanic, .007% African American, 39% white and .009% Asian.

School:

Ulysses High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 412 students in grades 9-12.

Curriculum:

The academic program is based on seven 51-minute classes daily. Seven credits per year is the maximum course load. Partnership and collaboration with Seward County Community College and Colby Community College enables sophomores, juniors, and seniors to enroll in freshman level courses for concurrent enrollment in Accounting, Animal Science, Business Law, Business Management, Human Resources Management, College Algebra, Trigonometry, Statistics, English Comp I, English Comp II, Public Speaking, CNA, Medical Terminology, Phlebotomy, College Psychology, College Sociology, Agricultural/Farm Animal type courses, Veterinary Medical Terminology or Nursing type courses, Medical Records & Veterinary Office Skills, Wind/Solar Technology courses, and Law Enforcement Operation/Procedures type courses.
